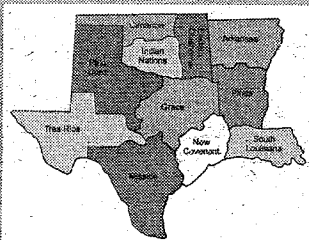

sense of purpose that her job in the legal profession wasn't offering. And in the silence, or more appropriately, in the music she *couldn't* silence in her head, she discovered a calling.

Jennifer returned home to Austin, convinced about where God was leading her. Within six months, she had sold her house; found a new home for her dog Lily; moved into an apartment and sold her car to reduce expenses; and given up her full-time position at an Austin law firm. Crazy, right?

The answer is a resounding no, if you listen to the fruits of Jennifer's labor since then. She took up the guitar; began composing music; started her business, Eine Kleine Worship Music; and recorded her first CD, *Seasons of Change*. Of course it helps that church music has been Jennifer's passion and avocation for most her life. She's gifted, with a voice smooth as caramel and pure as sunlight, and she lifts it joyfully with the assurance of one who trusts in God's goodness.

Many of the songs are Jennifer's own prayers — expressing gratitude, seeking guidance, praising. But their melodies are simple and meant to be sung by others. They speak to and for Christians in these times, offering comfort, soothing troubled spirits, energizing, and interpreting the human experience.

As she sings, "It's the ordinary things in our ordinary lives... that display the greatness of our God."

A natural performer, Jennifer has shared her story — punctuated with humor and infused with grace — with audiences in churches around Texas, at Moor Ranch Presbyterian Conference Center, at a Presbyterian Foundation gathering, and elsewhere. And in all things, her sense of God's call guides her: "May my voice, singing out Your truth, bring joy to the hopeless for You."
